Today we celebrate the life of **St Veronica**. Though her story appears late in the history of the early church, it relates to the very heart of the Gospel, Jesus' way to Golgotha. As he fell, carrying his cross on the way to be crucified, she wiped his face with her cloth. On the cloth was left an image of his face. Scholars have pointed out that Veronica's name may well derive from the story itself since Vera means 'true' and icon means 'image'. Thus she obtained the true image of Jesus. A veil of Veronica is preserved in Rome.
