**Easter Homily:** 'All the resurrection accounts are different and we cannot reconcile them. In the account from Mark 16 we read that three women came to the tomb. In the account from John 20, firstly Mary Magdalene and then Peter and John go to the tomb.

One of the things, however, all the resurrection accounts have in common is that the stone was rolled back from the entrance to the tomb. Have you allowed a stone to prevent you from meeting the risen Jesus? Have you allowed the stone of becoming engrossed in what you have and own and what others have and own to block your way to Jesus? You were adopted as God's son or daughter on the day you were baptised. If you are not living like a son or daughter of God roll away the stone. If you are not happy, that is a sure sign that the stone needs to be rolled away in your life. If you knew the risen Jesus you would have a joy in your heart that nothing else could give you.

Think of the total change that occurred in Paul's life after he met Jesus on the road to Damascus. You must roll away the stone for that! God has adopted you as his son or daughter. Thank God for this most wonderful privilege. If you had met the risen Jesus you would certainly know it. If you haven't yet met the risen Jesus, roll away the stone and meet Him.'
