Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7

Well here we are again in spirit if not in body. Welcome to our newsletter for another week. As the full impact of Covid 19 begins to become ever more apparent for us in Britain, I urge you to think, just for a moment, of those people in places where there is poor sanitation, little healthcare, food shortages and in the cases of the cramped refugee camps in the Middle East little chance of any social distancing or self-isolation. I received an email this week from The Leprosy Mission where there is a great fear for those with Leprosy as to how they are going to survive with all the poverty and other lack of basic needs listed above which attends them, together with the isolation and opprobrium often heaped on them by their community. The email ended with the wonderful quotation from Philippians which I've included above. Perhaps you might like to read it slowly relating it not only to our own predicament but also to those in far off shores where the situation is likely to be far, far worse

I do hope that you'll find time during the coming week to read the gospel and other readings which accompany this. There are also two short homilies taken off the internet which, hopefully, you will find of historical interest at least.

Despite being unable to gather in church, we give thanks for Glenn and Victoria and all those who are putting together and posting digital worship, enabling Christians throughout the country to be together in spirit as we relive the Easter story, a story which fills us with hope and confidence that there will be an end to the chaos of the Covid-19 Pandemic.

If you're able to, please follow Glenn as he live streams the Eucharist at 10.30 am this Sunday or watch Victoria as she daily live-streams Compline. (See the box below)
