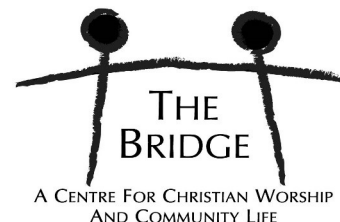

NEW NAME FOR THE HALL

Following the extension and complete refurbishment of our hall there has been discussion on the appropriate name for the hall.

After consideration of various alternatives the Bridge Church Council has decided that from henceforth the hall will be known as

THE BRIDGE CHURCH COMMUNITY HALL

In deciding on this name the Council felt that not only the identity of our church should be recognised but also the commitment we have to serving our community. The hall is used extensively by various church organisations which are open to everyone and every Thursday and Friday becomes our Café and Charity Shop. Many independent community groups also use the hall on a regular basis, as well as families for parties and social occasions.

The history of the hall is interesting. St. Luke's - one of the former churches now forming The Bridge - had no hall until 1927 when Mr Smith, a local businessman, paid for a hall to be built in Rectory Road on land adjacent to the old Rectory. It was called 'The Memorial Hall' in memory of his late wife who had been a prominent member of the church.

When Redditch New Town was being developed that hall was demolished by the New Town Development Corporation and the current hall was built for the church by them in 1972 as a replacement.

As we look to the future with the establishment of The Bridge and the extension of the hall a new name has been adopted to mark this new chapter in the life of the hall.

CHRISTIAN AID COLLECTION CO-ORDINATOR REQUIRED

The Bridge is looking for a new Christian Aid Co-ordinator to take over the role from Phil Drewell who is stepping down after his considerable period undertaking this important work.

In our support of the vital work of Christian Aid we are part of the national collection week. In Redditch the streets are shared amongst all the churches in the town. This week, in Mid May, raises a significant part of the income for Christian Aid and also raises national awareness of their work.

The role of The Bridge Co-ordinator is to prepare the batches of envelopes for each of our 'rounds', liaise with previous collectors to ask whether they can again collect and be the contact for new volunteers for rounds needing collectors. At the end of Christian Aid week, which is in mid-May, all envelopes are emptied and money banked (via the Post Office).

Phil Drewell will be very happy to talk to anyone seeking more information and will also be happy to guide the new Co-ordinator through the first year.
