Keep these in your mind and heart during the Office, and let the music wrap and lift.

Scripture reading

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me.

This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, 'Tell the daughter of Zion, look your king is coming to you, humble and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey'.

A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?'. The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee'

Matthew 21: 1-2, 4-5, 8-11

I think that even though he rode on a donkey they did not understand. They could not see that the donkey defined him, that the mute little beast with its gentle eyes was a sign of the utmost importance, however much the man on its back laughed. He was laughing as a small child laughs, a stranger to vanity and wounded pride, laughing because from the back of a donkey he looked at the world and saw its beauty, and maybe for a moment he believed that they saw it too. Maybe he believed that they sang and praised God because their eyes had been opened and they saw that the way to the kingdom was unfolding before them, in the laughter of a king who rode on a donkey.
