Today is also the day we remember S. Bede, northern Saint. His Shrine in Durham Cathedral is a beautiful place of prayer dear to many. Born around 670, and given to the monastery at Wearmouth at the age of 7, he lived most of his life as a monk at Jarrow; a life of prayer, study and teaching, insight and integrity, steeped in scripture. He was beloved by all his community. A famous and influential historian, writing 'A History of the English Church and People', and one of the first to write in English prose.
