**Jesus Christ is risen, hallelujah: He is risen indeed, hallelujah**

*Jesus said to his disciples, “....They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them.” John 14 v 21*

Last Sunday, and in a subsequent Government document, we had the Prime Minister’s pronouncements regarding the next phase of restrictions that we’re to follow regarding the Corona virus. These included some sensible relaxations of the lockdown, benefitting both the health and mental welfare of the population, and also benefitting the economy.

In the last edition of Spotlight I wondered what might be in it for us, the Church. Mmm, it turned out that not a lot was there, in fact really nothing at all. I haven’t heard from Rev Barry Jones this week, I suspect he may still be attached to the ceiling! Of course this further highlights the situation in Germany and other countries where limited access is allowed. And where is the reasonable voice of disagreement from the Church’s hierarchy to this continued closure? I certainly haven’t heard any.

Should we just sit back and accept things on the basis that as Christians we shouldn’t get involved in politics? Well Father Glenn has disagreed with this notion on a number of occasions in his sermons, and Bishop Desmond Tutu is reported to have wondered when he heard people say the Bible should be kept separate from politics as to what Bible they were reading, it certainly wasn’t the same copy as his.

I shall be writing to Ms Rachel MacLean MP with a copy to Bishop John asking them to make representation to the Government for a relaxation of some of the lockdown restrictions relating to churches. Needless to say there’ll be those who will say why it can’t be done, there always are, but we know it can, Germany and other countries can show us how. The spiritual health of the nation is a very important component of our regeneration from this awful pestilence. My letter alone will have no effect, it needs others to do likewise, lots of them.

*Have you yet tried the free worship phone line called **Daily Hope**? Launched by the Church of England it offer hymns, reflections and prayers. Archbishop Justin said: “With many in our country on lockdown, it’s important that we support those who are feeling lonely and isolated, whatever age they are. The Daily Hope service will allow people to hear hymns, prayers and words that offer comfort and hope, especially in this Easter season’. It’s available 24 hours a day on **0800 804 8044**, why not give it a try, after all it is free! **I have listened to it.** When I got through I chose option 2 and had a good old sing along to lots of well-known hymns, all for free.*

**Ascension Day:** Ascension Day, this coming Thursday, 21<sup>st</sup> May, marks the end of the Easter season and occurs ten days before Pentecost. In the New Testament, Jesus met several times with his disciples during the 40 days after his resurrection to instruct them on how to carry out his teachings. On the 40th day he took them to the Mount of Olives, where they watched as he ascended to heaven.
