Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit.” John 20 v 21-22

Have you managed to watch Father Glenn and Mother Victoria in the Toilet Roll Challenge in the online Diocesan Mailing yet? Or indeed an article by Victoria about supporting those with hearing loss to engage with others online. By highlighting the difficulties of those who can be marginalised through hearing loss in engaging in meetings on Zoom, Facetime or virtual services online it also gives the reader a brief insight into some of the trials and tribulations affecting those with hearing loss. Reading how Victoria has been trying to resolve issues in a very matter of fact way about things that we take so much for granted, is both sobering and humbling. A week on from me mentioning the return to schools and we’re still not sure when certain local ones will re-open, other than “when it is safe to do so”, which is of course the correct thing. Let’s pray for those who have these difficult decisions to make and for all teachers, pupils and parents when the drift back to schools does occur.

Did you know that according to several websites ‘*the term Pentecost comes from the Greek Πεντηκοστή (Pentēkostē) meaning “fiftieth”? It refers to the festival celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover, also known as the “Feast of Weeks” and the “Feast of 50 days” in rabbinic tradition.*’ It is also the 50th day after Easter Sunday. I have a suspicion that many of us more elderly folk will have been brought up using the word Whitsun or Whitsunday rather than Pentecost. Whit Monday, the day after Whitsun, remained a holiday in Britain until 1971 when, with effect from 1972, it was replaced with the Spring Bank Holiday on the last Monday in May. Whit was the occasion for varied forms of celebration and I remember with great fondness the Whitsun Rambles I attended in my youth. On one such event several church youth clubs caught a train out into the countryside, and I can remember our vicar calling one of the other priests to hurry up and get on the train. It caused much mirth to hear him calling ‘Father Christmas, Father Christmas do get on the train!’ And he had a beard, though sadly not a white one. Ah, those were the days.

Right at the beginning of lockdown I asked for people to send me in any birthdays or anniversaries that we might celebrate in this period of separation. I repeated it, but realised that I was flogging a dead horse and consequently gave up. Apart from Barry Jones’ recent anniversary, it would appear that no one has had anything to celebrate! Well this is my final call, do let me know if there is anything you’d like to share with us all.
